Greylag Goose <i>Anser anser</i>	Amber List	Fairly common introduced resident and uncommon breeder.	Probable breeder. Three pairs present on Lake 104.
Mallard <i>Anas platyrhynchos</i>	-	Common resident breeder and winter visitor.	Probably breeder. Thirty six adults recorded on Lake 104, many with juveniles.
Tufted Duck <i>Aythya fuligula</i>	-	Fairly common winter visitor and uncommon resident breeder.	Probable breeder. Twenty three birds present on Lake 104.
Great Crested Grebe <i>Podiceps cristatus</i>	-	Uncommon localised breeding resident and winter visitor.	Probable breeder. One pair recorded nesting on the SW side of 104. Other birds present on Lakes 103 and 104.
(Eurasian) Oystercatcher <i>Haematopus ostralegus</i>	Amber List	Increasing passage migrant and winter visitor and scarce breeder.	Probable breeder with one pair nesting on Site.
(Common) Moorhen <i>Gallinula chloropus</i>	-	Common breeding resident.	Probable breeder with one territory in SW of Lake 104, one in NE of Lake 104 and one in Lake 103.
(Common) Coot <i>Fulica atra</i>	-	Common winter visitor and fairly common breeding resident.	Probable breeder with seven territories on Lake 104 and two on Lake 103.
Black-headed Gull <i>Larus ridibundus</i>	Amber List	Common winter visitor and passage migrant. Vary scarce breeder.	Maximum of ten birds recorded. Likely breeder off-site.
Herring Gull <i>Larus argentatus</i>	Amber List	Common winter visitor and uncommon breeding resident.	Maximum of seven birds recorded. Likely breeder off-site.
Stock Dove <i>Columba oenas</i>	Amber List	Fairly common breeding resident.	One male recorded singing along southern boundary. Likely breeder off-site.
(Common) Wood Pigeon <i>Columba palumbus</i>	-	Abundant breeding resident.	Maximum of eight birds recorded. Probable breeder in larger trees along S boundary.
Green Woodpecker <i>Picus viridis</i>	Amber List	Fairly common breeding resident.	Recorded foraging on grassland along W side of Lake 104. May breed in trees along S boundary of site or off-site to the S.
(Barn) Swallow <i>Hirundo rustica</i>	Amber List	Common breeding summer visitor and passage migrant.	Numerous birds recorded foraging over Lake 104. Breeds off-site.

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(Winter) Wren <i>Troglodytes troglodytes</i>	-	Abundant breeding resident.	Probable breeder. Six territories in hedgerows round the site.
Hedge Accentor <i>Prunella modularis</i>	Amber List	Abundant breeding resident.	Probable breeder. Four territories in hedgerows around the Site.
(European) Robin <i>Erithacus rubecula</i>	-	Abundant breeding resident.	Probable breeder. Six to seven territories in hedgerows around the site.
(Common) Blackbird <i>Turdus merula</i>	-	Abundant breeding resident and passage migrant.	Probable breeder. Six territories in hedgerows around the site.
Song Thrush <i>Turdus philomelos</i>	Red List	Common breeding resident and passage migrant.	Probable breeder. Two territories in trees in E and N boundaries.
(Common) Whitethroat <i>Sylvia communis</i>	-	Common breeding summer visitor & passage migrant.	Probable breeder. Two territories around Lake 104.
Blackcap <i>Sylvia atricapilla</i>	-	Common breeding summer visitor and passage migrant; uncommon winter visitor.	Probable breeder. Two territories in scrub and trees in between Lakes 103 and 104, and along the S side of Lake 104.
Garden Warbler <i>Sylvia borin</i>	-	Fairly common breeding summer visitor and passage migrant.	Probable breeder. One territory in scrub and trees in on the south side of Lakes 103A and one off-site to the NE of Lake 103.
(Eurasian) Reed Warbler <i>Acrocephalus scirpaceus</i>	-	Fairly common breeding summer visitor and passage migrant.	Probable breeder with one territory on the W of Lake 104 and one on the S of Lake 103a.
(Common) Chiffchaff <i>Phylloscopus collybita</i>	-	Common breeding summer visitor & passage migrant; scarce winter visitor.	Probable breeder. One territory along S Site boundary.
Long-tailed Tit <i>Aegithalos caudatus</i>	-	Common breeding resident.	Maximum of six birds recorded. Possible breeder in shrubs within site.
Blue Tit <i>Parus caeruleus</i>	-	Abundant breeding resident.	Probable breeder. Five territories across site.
Great Tit <i>Parus major</i>	-	Abundant breeding resident.	Probable breeder. Five territories across site.
(Black-billed) Magpie <i>Pica pica</i>	-	Abundant breeding resident.	Maximum of two birds recorded. Possible breeder in trees along S Site boundary.
Carrion Crow <i>Corvus corone</i>	-	Common breeding resident.	Maximum of four birds recorded. Likely to breed off-site.
House Sparrow <i>Passer domesticus</i>	Red List	Common breeding resident.	Probable breeder. Five birds recorded in NE of Site.

Chaffinch <i>Fringilla coelebs</i>	-	Abundant breeding resident and winter visitor.	Probable breeder. Three territories in hedgerows around Site.
(European) Greenfinch <i>Carduelis chloris</i>	-	Common breeding resident and winter visitor.	Probable breeder. Three territories in hedgerows around Site.
(European) Goldfinch <i>Carduelis carduelis</i>	-	Fairly common resident and passage migrant.	Probable breeder. Two territories around lake 104.
Reed Bunting <i>Emberiza schoeniclus</i>	Red List	Fairly common resident breeder.	Probable breeder. Five territories in Site. One pair recorded from the SE of Lake 103, one pair from the S side of Lake 104, three pairs on the E side of Lake 104. One male also recorded just off-site to the NE.

Scarce	Very small numbers recorded virtually every year.	1-9
Uncommon	Recorded in low numbers each year.	10-99
Fairly Common	Reasonable numbers occur in suitable habitat.	100-999
Common	Good numbers occur regularly in suitable habitat.	1000-9999
Abundant	Large numbers occur in all suitable habitat.	10000+
